

The September Route 66 On The Air is a perfect operating event to do so.

Club Activities

We had a club breakfast at Jerry, WS7T's home on the 22nd and it was a great time with pancakes, sausage and eggs for breakfast. Oh, let's not forget the coffee, tea, and other goodies. Thanks to all that could find time to take part in this and a big thanks to Jerry's wife Tria for her hard work in putting it together and letting us into her home.

We had a FOX hunt on the 29th and Scott, KK7KBQ found it first again. Someone needs to step up and give him some competition. We will schedule a group hunt practice session this month so we can all fine tune our equipment and hone our skills.

We launched ANDY-1 balloon on 7-21-2023 at 13:40 UTC. It was an easy launch with the help of Alan, KK7LUC and Scott, KK7KBQ. We had a very light breeze and clear skies. The balloon ascended to 45,000ft (give or take) and proceeded to go to Mexico. Unfortunately, the last spot for ANDY-1 was on 7-26 at 15:04 UTC. It showed no sign of balloon failure (such as a drop in altitude) up to that point, so it might have been a hardware failure. We will never know. The Map shows its flight path. ANDY-1 was the last of the club sponsored balloons.



On the other hand, WB6RER HARC-1 is well into its 3rd circumnavigation around our world. We wish we knew why this balloon and tracker is doing so well. Its story and picture was put on the front page of QRZ.COM and has had over 5,000 views. We have tried to duplicate the balloon and have had a few failures since, so we believe there are things that are out of our control and happening when the balloons are at altitude.

Everyone can be proud of this accomplishment. It was a club effort and we would like to thank everyone who followed and are still following the balloons for their interest in the project.

When you look up this web site, it is obvious it has not been updated for the 2023 event. Well, they still have a little time to get it updated!

Generally speaking, all of our club members use the W6F call sign when they are on the air making contacts. We are the rare station for everyone to contact, so we call CQ. Coordination is via Mike, KG6ECW and his software protocol. The key is for us to have stations operating on each band and mode, but not two at the same time. An example - we can have three station on 20 meters, one on CW, one on SSB and another on FT-8; however, we can't have

two stations on 20 CW at the same time. The coordination last year went pretty well and this year should be the same.

We have club QSL cards to send to those stations who want our card, which is a wonderful way to show our club and WB6RER.
